## HERE WHEN YOU NEED US

"Yet again, Fresh Start was there when I needed it! And it felt just like home as if I never left! I was washing my car across the street, and somehow the doors locked- with my keys, phone, and wallet inside. The doors of Fresh Start were my first thought! I sat with staff (Cassie), and called a 24 hour locksmith. Thank God she was here, and Lincoln has many 24-hour lock smiths! And I have the money for a locksmith! None of it would be possible without all the help I got at Fresh Start.

I wouldn't have a car, a job or the funds to pay for it. I graduated from housing in August of this year- I phased out due to higher income. I just got a new job. Things are good. So, I just wanted to tell you THANK YOU!"

This was shared by Rachel (name has been changed), an alumna of Fresh Start. Rachel lived at Fresh Start a few years ago. At that time, she was new to recovery, looking for a full time job, and working to regain custody of her children. While at Fresh Start, she continued her sobriety journey, became employed in a professional setting, and bought a car. She moved into her own apartment and, most importantly, got her kids back.

"This place is an amazing asset in Lincoln."

Rachel said this about her experience at Fresh Start, "Unbelievable staff - they really do care. Their goal is to help women become successful members of society. As such, they hold the women accountable and expect them to be adults. I absolutely love them for this. I'm overwhelmingly grateful for the fresh start home, all the staff, the board of directors and the community that supports it all. I am beyond grateful to Fresh Start."

### SAFE AND SECURE

This upgrade is an important part of the safety and security measures we have in place for our residents, staff, and guests.

### NO SMALL CHANGE



Recently, while doing some spring cleaning at home, we found spare change in a few different places around the house. Pennies, nickels, dimes, and quarters found in drawers, under a chair, in various random places. There wasn't a lot of it, but all of those pennies added up to something more, when put together. Did you know in 2022, the approximate cost of each meal provided at Fresh Start was just 84 cents? That's small change with a big impact.

Perhaps people are like change. Some of us have the capacity to contribute more, some less. I don't only mean financially, that's just one piece. I also mean contributions of time, talent, and our emotional efforts. When you provide a listening and supportive ear, you are providing your time and an emotional investment. Name that tune! Do you remember that game show? Well, Fresh Start staff offer a similar activity- music bingo!



Team member Dawn organizes a music bingo competition with the shelter residents about once a month. She creates a playlist on her phone, and we have bingo cards. The residents compete to see who can guess the song, and mark the square.



Themes include cartoon theme songs, hair bands, and movie soundtracks. We also have seasonal playlists for Halloween and Christmas holidays. This spring she's adding playlists for and April Fool's Day (songs that copied other music or sound like other songs) and a one hit wonder list.

Fun activities like music bingo are more than a way to pass the time on a Saturday night. It's a time for residents to get together and take a break from the many stressors in their lives. It's one of the many ways we foster a sense of belongingness, which is key part of growth, building self esteem, and recovery.



"I do it because it's fun and upbeat. It's nice to hear the ladies sing along to the music and dance a little in their chairs. The music brings back happy memories. They get excited when they are the first one to pick the correct song," says Dawn. "I love to see them happy."

# THANK YOU, CINDY

In 2006, our Board of Directors was in the middle of renovating an old church in Havelock, which would be the new home of Fresh Start. Occupancy was moving from 16 to 24 women, and the bedrooms would all be on the lower level of the building. There was a lot of potential on the main floor, and someone suggested opening a small thrift shop to make use of the clothing donations the residents did not need. Cindy Piester, who had previously volunteered for the Junior League thrift shop (since closed), offered to gather information. That idea became The Daisy Thrift Shop.



Cindy still isn't quite sure how she was roped into becoming the first manager, but she agreed to get the shop up and running. The rest is history. Her partner in this endeavor since the beginning has been Karen Lenzen, another dedicated Fresh Start advocate. Every week for the past 16 years they have donated countless hours of their time to haul donations, sort them, and stock the shop. Cindy also has been the primary contact for the shop volunteers.

She's not leaving completely; Cindy plans to continue to volunteer in the shop as needed.
