"Life got better," according to Amanda, a former resident of Fresh Start.

Amanda was a resident of Fresh Start in 2018. Before that, she was staying at the People's City Mission and struggling with sobriety and other issues.

With the help of a Fresh Start case manager, she applied for apartments and found one. She now lives independently and attends AA meetings regularly. In February she observed her seventh year of sobriety.

In her new life Amanda is working on a BA in creative writing from UNL. She is writing her autobiography in the hope that the book will help women going through the same kinds of issues she did. "It will tell my story. The story of my life at Fresh Start is how my life went from miserable to a success," says Amanda.

As a volunteer every week she picks up the phone, answering questions and referring the callers to the right person. She also sorts and organizes donations to The Daisy, and helps with mailings and other clerical tasks.

Fresh Start gave her the confidence to do things herself. She learned she could be independent and live on her own. As Amanda says, she believes in herself now.

SHELTER HAPPENINGS



Saturday mornings the aroma of coffee wafts through Fresh Start while women circle around the table to enjoy Coffee Talk with Red Nelson, a Fresh Start case manager.

Coffee Talk is an opportunity for the women to get to know each other and bring a sense of belonging and comradery to Fresh Start. They came here believing that they didn't have anything in common with the other women. They find out differently during the coffee talks. The get-togethers provide an opportunity for the women to bond and make friends.

The talks often touch on subjects like addiction, sobriety, relationships, and trauma they may have experienced while they were homeless. They open up about their experiences in the past and dreams for their future.

Red, the case manager, may kick off the conversation by passing out articles to read or by asking general questions. "The coffee talks provide a way for women to connect, to support their peers, and to bond with each other," Red said.





FRESH START RECEIVES \$25K FROM HEALTHY BLUE NEBRASKA

Fresh Start, a transitional shelter for women experiencing homelessness, has received \$25,000 from Healthy Blue Nebraska to further its mission to empower women in overcoming barriers to self-sufficiency.

"This funding from Healthy Blue Nebraska will further our efforts to promote the health and well-being of the residents. Often our participants have not been in places or positions where they could focus on their health. While at Fresh Start, we encourage them to make this a priority, so that when they leave Fresh Start they are in a better place both physically and emotionally." said Monica Zinke, Fresh Start Executive Director.



Healthy Blue Nebraska also provided food baskets filled with fresh produce and non-perishable items to seven women on Fresh Start's community support program.

Fresh Start, located in Havelock, provides women experiencing homelessness with a safe place to stay while they work on personal goals to address the problems they face—substance abuse, domestic violence, involvement in the justice system, as well as physical and mental health challenges. Fresh Start provides women with the tools, resources, and skills development to live independently. Women come to Fresh Start for different reasons- but they all have the same goal: to improve their lives.
