#### Fresh Start: A Home Where Women Can Grow

### BURDENS: CHRISTY'S STORY

Christy wasn't born with a giant elephant on her back, but it wasn't long before it was firmly in place. And it would be a very long time before she was able to unload it.

Christy's elephant started when as a child she was sexually molested by her military father. She held that secret tightly. Her elephant continued to grow when her mother left and she felt abandoned and lost. Ironically, her mother was a practicing psychologist who couldn't or wouldn't help her daughter. As she reached her teens, Christy began drinking to help her carry the elephant—the burden that would not go away.

She would never talk about the load she was carrying. She hid it. For years. She kept it all inside which meant that potential friends were always on the outside. She could never let anyone close because of her trauma and her burden. And so, she drank to help with the ever-present pain.

She went to school. She liked to learn, earned good grades and played on sports teams—volleyball and softball—all while she was drinking.

After a series of DUIs and months of jail time, Christy hadn't changed. In fact, she was ready for one more big high that proved to be her last. Instead of the expected high, she was arrested and indicted on federal drug charges—six counts including conspiracy to deliver methamphetamine and marijuana. Today she's facing 10 years to life in a federal prison.

There is good news. Christy has finally shed the elephant that she carried around for years. She's used the opportunities she's been given through intensive therapy, drug rehabilitation programs and a home at Fresh Start to say goodbye to that elephant and more importantly to the person who used to carry it around.

Christy went down a path that was strewn with unimaginable pain and hopelessness. Now that is all changed. She credits Fresh Start for her reincarnation. It's where she found compassion and felt love. In turn she was able to make connections, meaningful connections, that were vital to her recovery.

"This program is needed. It's essential," she says. It was her lifeline to sobriety and to becoming a tax-paying citizen.

Christy is proof that an investment in women like her is a really good deal. There is more than one Christy out there. That woman and others like her will bring their own elephants with them to Fresh Start for help.

### BLOOMING FOR 15 YEARS THE DAISY CELEBRATES ITS ANNIVERSARY



In 2007, there were a lot of changes happening for Fresh Start. We moved into our new home in Havelock. The move to the larger facility allowed for many additions. Program occupancy increased from 16 women to 24 participants at a time. Those participants also gained much more communal living space. The program grew as well, offering more support and a more structured and holistic case management program. The move also provided a new opportunity for a fundraiser. The Board of Directors decided to dedicate one room of the new building for a small thrift shop. Cindy Piester, who was on the board at the time, agreed to help get it started. Longtime Fresh Start volunteer Karen Lenzen joined her, and The Daisy was born.

The name came from the Fresh Start logo, which features a Daisy. In the beginning, the shop was open just 2 hours, and sales were low. Slowly, word spread about the little shop in Havelock with the nice volunteers and great deals. They recruited more volunteers, which allowed it to be open more hours. The Daisy is now open 16 hours a week. Sales grew, going from maybe \$50 a week to an average of \$800. To date, The Daisy has raised over \$535,000 for Fresh Start!

The efforts of The Daisy ladies extend beyond the shop; they have an impact on many other aspects of the program. They are a shining example of what a dedicated and strong group of women can accomplish, and of how you can impact lives in unexpected ways. Fifteen years later, Cindy and Karen still manage the shop and everything that it entails. The crew of "Daisy ladies" has grown; there is now a management group of 8, plus another 30 or so volunteers who assist with the shop. From all of us at Fresh Start, thank you "Daisy ladies" for all you have given to Fresh Start.

### SHELTER HAPPENINGS

Women at Fresh Start work toward independence and self-sufficiency by creating an Individualized Goal Plan. They meet with their case manager to develop a plan that will guide them on the right path. Women work on the action steps they set for themselves. Action steps can include getting health insurance, learning to budget, building a support network, getting a driver's license, and developing a healthy support system. Staff assist with problem-solving, goal-setting, accessing the resources women need, and providing whatever help is necessary. Having a goal plan guides women's progress as they steer through the obstacles that have sidetracked their lives. Fresh Start is always there to help them on the right path.

## FRESH START CELEBRATES 15 YEARS OF THE DAISY THRIFT SHOP

Fifteen years ago, a group of volunteers decided to transition from a huge annual garage sale to a more permanent fundraising opportunity, and The Daisy Thrift Shop was born. Fresh Start hoped that their numerous garage sale customers would follow them across town to shop at The Daisy and they did. Fresh Start has since continued to grow their customer base at an exciting pace. The building is "free" to Fresh Start – no rent or utilities – and all of the saleswomen are volunteers, allowing them to stream all of their profits back into the Fresh Start program. In 2021, The Daisy raised over \$45,000, and to date they have raised over half a million dollars for the women's shelter.
