### LOOKING PAST THE SURFACE

"Anne" came to Fresh Start after trying other programs. She was described as threatening, due to her past and due to her tough demeanor. She sought a place to continue her sobriety, find work, and get some support. She was beginning to think that the struggle to change wasn't worth it or possible. *"When I got to Fresh Start I was lost, alone, and living my life in fear. I felt hopeless."* 

The Fresh Start team quickly determined that she was a good fit for the program. Anne was very responsible and determined to improve herself and her situation. She also was very kind, and often helped other residents. Her great sense of humor could put people at ease. By the time she completed the program, she had a good job, was saving money, and had built new friendships. Finding a place that would rent to her with her past legal charge proved to be nearly impossible. After months of searching, she was finally approved to co-rent an apartment with a close friend, someone she met at Fresh Start. They visit Fresh Start often to see other friends and say hi to staff. Anne shares, "Because of Fresh Start, my life has completely changed. I'm living my life right, sober, and have hope."

## REMEMBERING A FIERCE SOUL

Cynthia Peterson was a strong woman, and a fierce advocate for many social justice issues, including poverty and homelessness. Her advocacy led her to the Fresh Start Board in 2011. Cynthia served on the board for 10 years, and held several offices. She then continued to be involved with the fund development and capital campaign committees.



Fresh Start benefited her vast knowledge of many subjects, her tireless passion to serve, and time she generously gave to further our mission to empower women experiencing homelessness. She always strove to make a difference, to make things better for our community and world.

It is with great sadness that we learned of her passing in August of this year. We envision that she is now in a beautiful garden with Bob and JoDell and other family, listening to jazz and having lively conversations.

## WORDS FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR



I talk a lot about balance at Fresh Start. For example, we balance accountability and structure with empowerment and choice. Many of our residents have had a life full of upheaval, full of feeling off balance or unsteady. We find ways to provide a reliable environment, with clear expectations. Each resident has responsibilities as part of the program, but they mostly set their own schedule to accomplish them. There are some required activities dictated by Fresh Start (i.e. cooking and cleaning), and some that each resident sets for themselves (i.e. their personal goal plan).

We looked for balance in the recent renovations as well; more leisure space (the "zen lounge") and more work space (the new offices and resource areas). Work and play. Durable yet cozy. When we went to redecorate, we were very intentional with our selections. Finding balance was again in the forefront of these efforts. Just as we often did regarding the renovations, we first went to our residents. We took note of what furnishings were their favorites, and what they wanted. Yes, it is our facility but it is also their home. We looked for items of various artistic styles, textures, and sizes. We sought items that would inspire and also represent our participants. Some are serious, some are more lighthearted. Some original artwork, some photography, some prints. We wanted there to be enough variety that something would speak to each person. ### FOR WOMEN, BY WOMEN

The Daisy team has often used the tag line "for women, by women." It's an appropriate line, as the shop is completely staffed by volunteers. This group of dedicated and talented women serve as shop manager, sorters, stockers, marketers, and more! Thanks to them, The Daisy raised over \$52,000 in 2024, which provided funding for our crucial services for women experiencing homelessness.



The Daisy would like to expand the team! Are you a current shopper? Or, looking for a place to give back and volunteer? The Daisy is flexible option. Volunteers are asked to work one shift per month, with options of 2, 3, or 4 hours. Examples of roles include:

- Shop Clerk
- Accepting and/or sorting newly arrived donations
- Sorting/preparing items for the shop

The shop is open Wednesdays and Thursdays from 4-6pm, which is one shift per night. Fridays and Saturdays the shop is open 10am-4pm, which is divided into two shifts.
